A Savior Has Been Born

This Advent season we will be studying five names of Jesus. The first name that we'll consider is **Savior**.

Jesus saves. Past, present and future.

[Q] From Ephesians 2:1-3, what does Jesus want to save us from? What is the danger?

[Q] What did Jesus do? Read Romans 5:8-10.

Jesus not only saves us from the penalty of sin, He also saves us from the power of sin.

[Q] Read Titus 2:11-14.

How does the grace of God save us in the present? (11-12)

How have you experienced this in your life? Please explain.

How will He save us in the future? (13-14)

[Q] What is the role of God's grace and mercy according to Ephesians 2:4-9?
